NCTracks Set for July 2013 Launch

In December 2008 the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) awarded a contract to Computer Sciences Corporation (CSC) to develop and implement a replacement Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS) in support of health care administration for multiple DHHS divisions. The replacement system, named NCTracks, is a multi-payer system that will facilitate provider enrollment and consolidate claims processing activities for multiple DHHS health plans.

The Legacy MMIS+ is more than 34 years old and lacks the flexibility to adapt to the changing needs of government and to incorporate the benefits of current technology.

NCTracks will replace and coordinate processing between the existing Legacy MMIS+ for the Division of Medical Assistance, the Integrated Payment and Reporting System (IPRS) for the Division of Mental Health and the Purchase of Medical Care Services (POMCS) for the Division of Public Health and the Office of Rural Health and Community Care.

NCTracks will coordinate processing among the divisions to ensure the proper assignment of the payer, benefit plan and pricing methodology for each service on a claim.

The project team continues enrollment, verification and credentialing of providers through early operations activities, as construction and testing of the new system remain on schedule. Beginning in March 2013, the project will enter into the Provider Operational Preparedness period, a time frame designed to allow a representative sample of providers to compare claims processing between NCTracks and the legacy DHHS systems that will be incorporated into the new

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system. Following provider readiness, training and cut over activities, NCTracks is scheduled to begin full operations July 1, 2013. The State has the option of beginning full operations anytime between March 1 and July 1, 2013, with 30 days advance notice provided to key stakeholders. The communications team will keep providers and other stakeholder groups apprised of any changes to the implementation schedule.
